

Archeology Field School

Field School Information

Locations:

We will be based in Kanab, UT, where we will excavate a prehistoric Pueblo site. In addition to our excavations in Kanab, we will conduct archaeological survey work on nearby private and public lands, including Zion National Park. The field school curriculum also incorporates fieldtrips to regional sites of interest.

We provide food and lodging in Kanab, UT for the duration of the field-school.

Dates:

First SUU Summer Session: June 1, 2010 - July 2, 2010 for students taking the 6 credit option. Students pursuing either of the 3 credit options will either attend for the first 12 days (June 1 -June 12), or the last 12 days of the course (June 12 -July 2).

Cost:

Total cost for students taking ANTH 4960 for 6 credits is \$1,788. This amount includes SUU summer session tuition and fees for 6 semester credit hours (\$1,488) plus a course fee of \$300.00 to help pay for field supplies, food, lodging and transportation.

Students registering for the 3 credit option (ANTH 2920) will pay a total of \$948 This amount includes SUU summer session tuition and fees for 3 semester credit hours (\$798) plus a course fee of \$150.00 to help pay for field supplies, food, lodging, and transportation.

Non-SUU students will also need to pay the \$40.00 SUU Admission application fee. Please contact the registrar's office (<http://suu.edu/ss/registrar/> , ph. # (435) 586-7715) for more information on applying to SUU.

Financial Aid:

No previous experience required. The school is intended primarily for undergraduate students. Students must meet SUU admission requirements as outlined in the catalog. Graduate students may enroll subject to the approval of the faculty of the program in which they are regularly enrolled. Persons who do not want college credits may enroll as an audit. Audit charges are the same as those assessed for credit enrollment.
