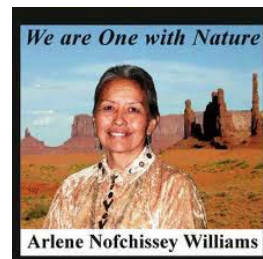


REQUIRED LECTURES

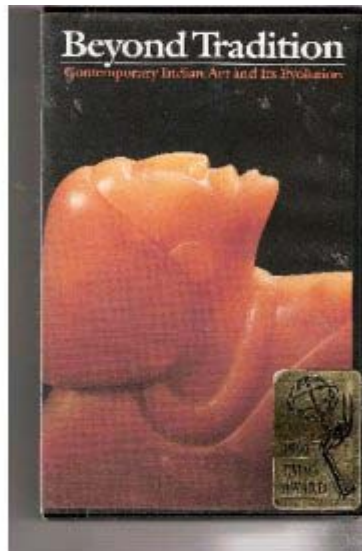
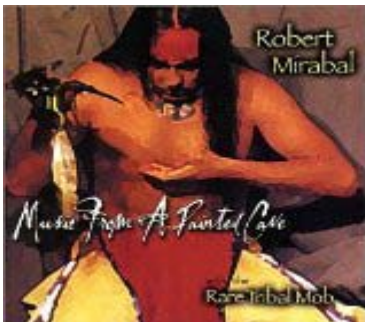
