Mr. Wolske has received his MFA in Graphic Design from Indiana University and has been teaching and freelancing throughout Indiana and Illinois. Currently he is working as a Project Coordinator for the Book Arts Program at the J. Willard Marriott Library, The University of Utah. David's work has been published in "New Vintage Type" by Gail Anderson and Steven Heller and he has received awards from the American Institute of Graphic Arts, Type Director's Club, and the Society of Typographic Arts, Chicago.
