

UNIVERSITY CURRICULUM COMMITTEE MEETING
April 30, 2003 4:00 P.M.
GREAT BASIN ROOM

University Studies Courses Rod presented UNIV courses and stated they need to be placed in the regular academic areas. (See attachment). After review of the courses it was moved by Allen Hamlin to move Girl's State into the political science curriculum and Governor's Honors Academy will remain in UNIV with no more than 3 credit hours given for credit. The motion was seconded by Stan Gwin.

Discussion followed concerning the hours earned for credit. Stan Gwin questioned the American Sign Language courses and proposed that these courses be moved into special education or the foreign language areas. The department chairs will be contacted to see where the Governor's Honors Academy will be placed. A vote was taken and it passed unanimously.

The COMM 4750 course that was presented at the last meeting did not pass the Dean's Council as academic credentials were not adequate. Anyone who wants to teach with less than a Master's Degree will need to provide a portfolio for the degree they desire to teach.

English Course Proposal A new English course, ENGL 1000, was proposed for students who have an ACT score below 17 in English. Students with low scores presently register for ENGL 0990 and ENGL 0900. The English Department desires to create the ENGL 1000 course with a Pass/Fail grade and take this course in conjunction with ENGL 1010, where the student will be required to pass the course with a grade of at least a C-. Jeff Su indicated that this course had not been approved by the curriculum subcommittee. Jeff Su motioned that this course be presented to the subcommittees where it will be reviewed. The motion was seconded by Ty Redd.

Stan Gwin motioned to amend the motion to approve the course for fall term only as a pilot course, and with the understanding that it be reevaluated before the end of fall semester and change the syllabus. The motion was seconded by Verlinda Angell.

Discussion followed and questions were raised as to the proposed English 1000 program. A vote was taken for this course to go procedurally to the subcommittees or reject the entire English 1000 course. The vote was 3 in favor and the majority voted to reject.

After the chairs of the subcommittees visited, Stan Gwin motioned to accept ENGL 1000 as a pilot course only, readdress the items listed in the syllabus, and revisit this again fall semester. The motion was seconded by Lee Montgomery.

Allen Hamlin questioned whether this be an experimental or pilot program. A vote was taken and it passed unanimously.

Artis Grady presented curriculum proposals for the Applied Technology Department. The curriculum subcommittee approved CM 2100-Finishing, from 2 credits to 3 credits; new courses, CM 4400-HVAC and Plumbing Principles and Design (3 cr.); CJ 2110-Introduction to Private Security, (3 cr.); CJ 4710-Comparative Criminal Justice Systems, (3 cr.); and TE 4820-Technology Life Careers/Foundations of Technology (3 cr.).

Richard Wittwer discussed the reasoning for the changes and stated that the proposals were submitted for compliance for accreditation and articulation purposes.

A vote was taken and it passed unanimously.

Artis presented courses in Technology Education. It was proposed to delete TE 4910, TE 4850, and TE 1150. A new course proposal, TE 4820-Technology Life Careers/Foundations of Technology (3 cr.). A vote was taken and it passed unanimously.

It was proposed to delete CM 1280-Plumbing and CM 4300-Heating, Vent/Air Conditioning and combine the two courses into one new course CM 4400 (3 cr.). The subcommittees approved the changes. A vote was taken and it passed unanimously.

The proposals for the Bachelor of Science degree requirements in Applied Technology were discussed. Kim Craft motioned to table this proposal. These courses should be presented to the College of Science and their respective areas for their discussion and decision before the University Curriculum Committee takes a vote on the course proposals. A vote as taken and it passed unanimously.

Ty Redd stated that ENGR 1030 needs to be deleted. Seconded by Artis Grady. No action was taken.

General Education Stan Gwin motioned that the Curriculum Committee of each College identify the essential General Education Knowledge Areas which are shared by each discipline within the college, and examine each GE course offered in the college to ensure that all knowledge areas are part of each course.

Discussion followed concerning the courses in ATS College. Rod strongly stated that at the State level there are many courses offered in GE as a menu of courses that students can select from. The curriculum committee needs to look at reducing the number of GE courses offered. Any changes will need to be approved by the college committees. A vote was taken and it passed unanimously.

Rod indicated that the University Curriculum Committee will be reorganized by this fall.

A memo concerning the Study Abroad program was handed out to each committee member for review.
