MINUTES

Present: Rodney D. Decker, Dianne Werber, Elise Leahy for Kirk Fitzpatrick, Shauna Mendini, Lee Montgomery, Jeff Barnes, Lindsey Anderson, Karl Stevens, Dave Ward, Micah Keith, Vic Brown, Terry Alger, and Judy Higbee.

School of Business Jeff Barnes presented ACCT 3400 – Auditing I; ACCT 4200 – Tax Research and Advanced Topics; FIN 3110 – Risk and Insurance; FIN 3250 – Managerial Finance I; FIN 3770 – Financial Institutions and Markets; and MGMT 3100 – Production/Operations Management. These courses are all consent changes and/or prerequisite modifications; seconded by Terry Alger. Discussion followed. Shauna reminded committee members that when consent items are presented, syllabus will not be required. A vote was taken and it passed unanimously.

College of Humanities and Social Sciences Rod presented PSY 4500 – Special Topics: Motivation and Emotion to PSY 3270 – Motivation and Emotion. This will be a new course taught on a regular basis. Elise moved for approval; seconded by Dave Ward. Discussion followed concerning student enrollment and faculty load. There is no problem with either concern. A vote was taken and it passed unanimously.

Rod presented Psychology 4530 – Forensic Psychology as a new course which will assist in the forensic science area. This course will be taught once per year. Jeff motioned for approval; seconded by Elise Leahy. Discussion followed to support the course. A vote was taken and it passed unanimously.

College of Science Terry Alger presented CHEM 3000 – Quantitative Analysis, to be taught every year in the fall, and CHEM 4990 – Chemical Literature and Seminar, to be taught every spring; seconded by Jeff Barnes. There was no discussion and the vote pass unanimously.

Minor Degree Rod stated that all deans have been requested to visit with departments concerning the number of hours required for a minor. Discussion involved addressing a minimum of 16 credit hours required for a minor; with anything over 18 hours needing a written statement and justification. Further discussion will occur in future meetings. Provost Harraf and Rod will communicate with deans and department chairs regarding this recommendation with UCC members being informed.

Second Baccalaureate Degree – SUU policy was discussed. The committee felt policy should be followed unless compelling evidence indicates that other institutions in the system or nation-wide provide general exceptions to SUU policy. Attempts of further clarification will be made in contacting commissioners' office and other institutions in

the system. Committee members felt that granting of two degrees under no conditions should diminish the importance of a degree. Also, when one of the degrees requires a stand-alone minor, the requirements for a minor must be met.
