

UNIVERSITY CURRICULUM MEETING
THURSDAY, January 11, 2007
4:00 P.M. - CN 233

MINUTES

Present: Rod Decker, Shauna Mendini, Terry Alger, Genell Harris, Lindsey Brown, Jim Brandt, Vic Brown, Kirk Fitzpatrick, Lee Montgomery, Dianne Werber, Excused: Bart Reynolds and Jeff Barnes. Others: Del Beatty, Mark Baker, Shawna Cope, and Rick Lampson.

General Education Shauna Mendini presented the following courses to be added to general education; ECON 2010 – Principles of Microeconomics, ECON 2020 – Principles of Macroeconomics, and FIN 2870 – Personal Finance. TECH 1950 was deleted from GE as it did not meet the submission deadline. The motion was seconded by Kirk Fitzpatrick; there was no discussion and the vote to accept was unanimous.

College of Education Genell Harris presented course sequencing changes for ECED 3910 – will not be offered in the summer; ECED 3930 – will not be offered in the summer; EDRG 4010 – will not be offered in the summer; EDRG 4040 – will not be offered in the summer; EESL 4340 – will not be offered in the summer; offered in the Spring; FLHD 1500 – taught Fall Spring, and Summer; FLHD 3350 – will be offered in the Spring; not in the Fall; FLHD 3500 – will be offered in the Fall; not in the Spring; FLHD 3950 – will be offered in the Fall; SPED 4130 - will be offered in the Spring; not in the Fall; SPED 4140 - will be offered in the Spring; not in the Fall; SPED 4185 - will be offered in the Spring; not in the Fall; seconded by Jim Brandt. There was no discussion and the vote passed unanimously.

Genell presented courses submitted at the December 6, 2006, meeting that were tabled in the Physical Education and Human Performance area; PE 1085; PE 1100; PE 1110; PE 1130; PE 1133; PE 1145; PE 1300; PE 1305; PE 1350; PE 1355; PE 1360; PE 1365; PE 1610; PE 1611; and PE 1625 for course credit change from .5 credit to 1 credit; seconded by Shauna Mendini. There was no discussion and the vote passed unanimously.

Genell presented new courses in PE 1057 – Yoga all level; PE 1058 Intermediate Yoga; PE 1059 Ashtanga Yoga; PE 1105 Badminton; PE 1125 Pickleball; and PE 1527 Intro to Climbing; seconded by Terry Alger. Discussion followed with concerns relative to resources, budget, enough faculty to teach to courses, faculty credentials, will the courses be self-support, and course fee questions. Rick Lampson indicated that funds are available and PE would be applying for national accreditation in Yoga through the Yoga Alliance Certification Program. Following discussion the committee voted to approve the courses dependent upon a visit with the Provost to address the concerns raised. The vote was unanimous.

Genell presented dance courses in PE; PE 1735 International Latin Ballroom Dance Bronze; PE 1736 International Latin Ballroom Dance Silver; PE 1737 International Latin Ballroom Dance Gold; PE 1739 American Ballroom Dance Bronze; PE 1740 American Ballroom Dance Silver; PE 1742 American Ballroom Dance Gold; PE 1743 International Standard Ballroom Dance Silver; PE 1742 International Standard Ballroom Dance Bronze; PE 1744 International Standard

Ballroom Dance Gold; PE 2150 Ballroom Dance Company – Back up Team; PE 2160 Ballroom Dance Company – Tour Team; PE 1715 Beginning Country Western Social Dance; seconded by Jim Brandt. Questions were raised concerning the overlapping of PE dance with TAD. Shauna indicated that ballroom dance would be alright if it was not in the dance accreditation program but could be taught at SUU if it was clearly defined. These courses would add nine new courses; are there enough rooms, resources, budget, staff, and credentials of staff to cover these courses? The course syllabi for all courses were similar or almost identical to each other. Following discussion, a vote was taken; 1 vote in favor, 1 abstention and 3 nays. The vote died due to lack of support.

Terry Alger moved that the courses be readdressed by the original committees to readdress the credit hours, resources, and facilities needed; seconded by Kirk Fitzpatrick. The vote passed unanimously.

College of Performing and Visual Arts Shauna Mendini presented course description change for ART 4890; and changes in course sequencing for ART 1130 3-D Design - change to offered Fall, Spring; ART 2110 Drawing II - change to offered Fall, Spring; ART 4890 Internship - change to offered Fall, Spring, Summer; ART 5890 Internship - change to offered Fall, Spring, Summer; ARTH 4740 Nineteenth Century Art - change to offered Fall, every other year; ARTH 4750 Twentieth Century Art - change to offered Spring, every other year; seconded by Terry Alger. There was no discussion and the vote passed unanimously.

Shauna presented Letter of Intent to offer a Bachelor of Arts in Studio Arts and a Bachelor of Arts in Art History; seconded by Kirk Fitzpatrick. Discussion followed concerning (pg. 2) Italian not being offered at SUU and should include “Spanish” and (pg. 4) to remove Dr. Marvic and use “faculty” in its place. There was question on the number of students served. Following discussion a vote was taken to approve with the above stated corrections being made. The vote passed unanimously.

College of Integrated Engineering and Technology Jim Brant presented state mandated changes in remedial math courses;

Math 0990

Students with no Math ACT score, or scores older than two years must take the placement exam.

Math 1010

A recent (within the last two years) Math ACT of at least 18 or successful completion of Math 0990 within the last two years.

Math 1020

A Recent (within the last two years) Math ACT of at least 14.

Math 1030

A recent (within the last two years) Math ACT of at least 23, or a grade of C or better in Math 1010 or 1020 within the last two years.

Math 1040

A recent (within the last two years) Math ACT of at least 23, or a grade of C or better in Math 1010 within the last two years.

Math 1050

A recent (within the last two years) Math ACT of at least 23, or a grade of C or better in Math 1010 within the last two years.

Math 1060

A recent (within the last two years) Math ACT of at least 23, or a grade of C or better in Math 1010 within the last two years; seconded by Kirk Fitzpatrick.

There was no discussion and the vote passed, three in favor and one no vote.

Jim presented courses in construction management. These courses were approved at an earlier meeting but the department desires to add lab classes; CM 2015 Framing Systems Lab, Co-requisite: CM 2010; CM 2055 Concrete and Masonry Lab, Co-requisite: CM 2050; CM 2105 Finishing Systems Lab, Co-requisite: CM 2100; CM 4405 HVAC & Plumbing Principles & Design Lab, Prerequisite: CM 4400. CM 1290 Electrical Systems was presented for credit hour change, 2 credits to 3 credits. Jim indicated that resources to teach the labs will come from the sale of the house. A vote was taken and it passed unanimously.

Jim presented changes in course description for CSIS 1400 – Fundamentals of Programming and CSIS 2810 – Computer Organization and Architecture; EET 2780 was approved by the CIET for a prerequisite to CSIS 2810; seconded by Genell Harris. There was no discussion and the vote passed unanimously.

Jim presented changes Technology Education Composite. Remove ACCT 2020 to Construction Management Bachelor's degree; remove TECH 3000 Occupational Safety, (Safety techniques will be taught as part of individual classes); and APE Degrees, changed to A Single Pre Engineering Degree; seconded by Kirk Fitzpatrick. There was no discussion and the vote passed unanimously.

College of Humanities and Social Sciences Kirk Fitzpatrick presented changes in course sequencing for communication courses to spring alternate years in; COMM 3460 – Broadcast Management; COMM 3140 – Broadcast Writing; COMM 4140 – Advanced Reporting; COMM 4440 – Feature Writing; seconded by Terry Alger. There was no discussion and the vote passed unanimously.

Kirk presented changes in course number credit hours for CJ 4832 (2) credits to CJ 4830 (1-3) credits; seconded by Terry Alger. There was no discussion and the vote passed unanimously.

Kirk presented title and course description changes for PSY 4510 Biopsychology to PSY 4510 Brain and Behavior, and remove co-requisite PSY 4511; PSY 4511 Biopsychology Lab to PSY 4511 Brain and Behavior Lab and remove PSY 4510 as a prerequisite; keep as a co-requisite; seconded by Jim Brandt. Discussion followed concerning the length of the course descriptions and contact hours for the courses and labs. Kirk will address these concerns and have Dr. White make the necessary changes. The voting was unanimous to approve with the corrections being made.
