

4-Year Academic Plan: Elementary Education with Teaching Licensure

The following is a sample outline for completion of this bachelor's degree AND state-required courses for becoming a licensed teacher (completion of licensing may require a semester(s) beyond four years). Each student's reality will vary slightly, as this plan does not include transfer work, Advanced Placement (AP), or concurrent enrollment credits. Math and English placement will be based on the student's ACT/SAT scores. **PLEASE NOTE:** The following plan assumes students are prepared to take the Math course listed. If prerequisites are required, additional semesters may be required to complete the degree.
