
STUDENT ALUMNI '24-'25

The SUU Student Alumni Association (SAA) is a dynamic student organization dedicated to serving campus, connecting alumni to their alma mater, and preserving SUU's rich traditions through the Legacy and Tradition Keeper programs. This was a year of exponential growth with the launch of the Tradition Keeper app, which transformed student engagement on campus. Within just two months, students completed over 7,000 traditions (2,000 more than the entire previous year)! SAA's expanded reach included surpassing 1,000 followers on a new Instagram account and earning recognition at the CASE ASAP conference, where they presented Tradition Keeper's success to statewide audiences. The year culminated with SAA securing a new \$0.25 student fee per semester, providing sustainable funding to advance the program's continued growth and keep T-Bird traditions alive.





FOUNDERS DAY CELEBRATION



MOUNTAIN CENTER PLAQUE UNVEILING

SUU Founders Week kicked off with the unveiling of a commemorative plaque at the SUU Mountain Center, recognizing contributors who made this unique facility possible. Located 4.5 miles from Cedar City on a 2,800-acre ranch, the 6,000-square-foot log cabin has served the University and community since 1943. The plaque honored visionary families including the Kumen Jones and D. Perry

Mackelprang families, along with leaders like Gerald R. Sherratt and the 1985 Mountain Center Steering Committee. Family members who were the first stewards of the mountain property and who worked to establish and preserve this treasured place received commemorative pictures during the meaningful ceremony, celebrating generations of dedication to SUU's mission.



10th COMMEMORATION OF DOCUDRAMA: "BACK UP THE MOUNTAIN"

SUU's 100th Annual Founders Awards Banquet celebrated the University's remarkable founding story and the 10th anniversary of the acclaimed docudrama "Back up the Mountain," with actor Jasen Wade Nielsen serving as emcee after portraying Neil Bladen in the short film. The evening highlighted the extraordinary 1898 story of Cedar City residents who faced an impossible task: construct a state-required three-story brick building in just eight months during a record-cold winter or lose the school entirely.

This mammoth undertaking underscored the commitment of Cedar City residents to education and community, and brought a founding story that rivals any other institute of higher education. The cast and crew, who transformed historical accounts into compelling visual storytelling, were all recognized at the Founders Awards Banquet. This milestone celebration served as a reminder of the sacrifices and determination of Southern Utah University's early pioneers who will continue to inspire students and community members for generations.

Participants in First SUU Day of Service

SUU's inaugural Day of Service on March 29, 2025, united over 150 T-Birds (students, faculty, staff, alumni, and local residents) for 310 hours of community service during Founders Week. Red-shirted volunteers tackled projects across Cedar City and Iron County, including: landscaping at Canyon Creek Services Domestic Violence Shelter and Festival Country K9s Dog Park, removing graffiti, cleaning up I-15 interchanges with the City of Enoch, crafting blankets for Iron County Holiday Assistance, and assembling "I Spy" bags for Cedar City Hospital patients.

As Assistant Vice President Ron Cardon noted, "The SUU Day of Service is a perfect way to wrap up a great Founders Week... This day was an opportunity for SUU to give back to the community that so generously supports us."

The event exemplified SUU's commitment to preparing students as lifelong community contributors, while also strengthening the University's deep ties to the region that has supported it since 1897.


