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## PPAT Task 4: Implementing and Analyzing Instruction ([Task 4 Deep Dive videos](#))

### Headlines

***There are five “steps”***

- Step 1: Planning
- Step 2: Implementing the Plan
- Step 3: Understanding the Two Focus Students
- Step 4: Reflecting
- Step 5: Uploading the Video

***There are seven “artifacts”***

***There are nine “textboxes” that correspond to the artifacts, plus one for contextual factors (approx. 9 pages of commentary)***

- representative pages of a standards-based lesson plan (2 pages)
- baseline data (e.g., graphic representation, table, list) for the whole class
- baseline data (e.g., graphic representation, table, list) specific to Focus Student 1
- baseline data (e.g., graphic representation, table, list) specific to Focus Student 2
- a student work sample from Focus Student 1
- a student work sample from Focus Student 2
- one fifteen-minute video (mandatory), which may contain one fifteen-minute segment (unedited) or three five-minute segments (each unedited) combined one file

### ***Task Insights***

- *Task 4 will need you to upload a video.*
- *Plan ahead. Task 4 requires a standards-based lesson plan for your whole class that addresses learning needs, includes instructional strategies to engage students, and incorporates assessment techniques to gauge student learning. The lesson plan needs to provide baseline data from both the whole class and the two Focus Students, work samples from the Focus Students, and a fifteen-minute video.*
- *Before teaching the lesson Look at guiding prompts in Steps, 2, 3, and 4 **before** you teach the lesson so you will be able to successfully reflect on the lesson.*
