Our public history Association has existed for over twenty years and continues a proud tradition and purpose to protect, preserve, and interpret the Old Spanish Trail, including all of its related historic routes and branches, with a primary focus on those portions designated as the Old Spanish National Historic Trail - a part of the federal National Trails System. The historic route known as the Old Spanish Trail was utilized most regularly in the years from 1829 - 1848 for trade between Santa Fe, New Mexico and Los Angeles, California. Multiple routes between these thriving Mexican cities of the 19th century ran through New Mexico, Colorado, Utah, Arizona, Nevada, and California. As mentioned the Association provides public information, education, and interpretation of the Trail, works on Trail planning and management with the federal coadministering agencies of the Trail -- the National Park Service and the Bureau of Land Management, and conducts various historic, anthropological, and other research on the Trail to fulfill the aforementioned efforts.
