

Reinstatement – Travel & Reentry

A new I-20/DS-2019 may be required of students who have recently had their I-20/DS-2019 terminated. This new I-20/DS-2019 will have a new SEVIS ID number. There are many situations that may lead to the termination of an I-20/DS-2019, including:

- Absences from the United States greater than 5 months
- Any violation of visa maintenance requirements

Once a new I-20/DS-2019 has been received, the student will need to activate the new I-20/DS-2019 through exit and reentry to the United States. After activation, the student should check-in with ISSS.

Note: If a new I-20 is issued, you will not be eligible for CPT or OPT until a year has passed from the start date listed on your new I-20

Requesting a New I-20/DS-2019 from SUU

- 1. Submit new financial support information
- Provide SUU with an accurate mailing address where the I-20/DS-2019 will be mailed, or arrange for pick up from ISSS
- 3. Pay the SEVIS I-901 Fee, for information visit: http://www.fmjfee.com

- b. Print and carry the SEVIS I-901 payment receipt with you when crossing the border
 4. Contact the US Consulate in your area to find out if you will need a new F-1 visa.
 - a. Students pursuing this option will need an unexpired visa to reenter the country. If the visa is currently expired, the student will need to renew their visa before entering the United States.
