






Trimesters beginning 2020







She continues to work in emergency departments on Native American reservations throughout the country, and her experiences inspired her to go back to school to earn her DNP degree at Johns Hopkins University, which she completed this past July. Additionally, this year the National Center for American Indian Enterprise Development named her a recipient of the Native American Top 40 Under 40 award.


LEVEL 2






The level four students will be having their pinning ceremony December 13th. They are all excited to finally be done with school and cannot wait to put their nursing skills to the test in the real world!


