A free concert will be performed in the Thorley Recital Hall on Saturday, April 23, 2016 at 7:30 p.m. and will feature guest artists, Brad Dutz and Chris Wabich along with the SUU Percussion Ensemble. Under the direction of Dr. Lynn Vartan, the SUU percussion students have been preparing for this festival and concert throughout the semester. Vartan says, "The Percussion Festival is an opportunity for SUU students as well as high school students and others interested in percussion to interact with professional percussionists from around the world.
