DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The Secret Garden is a story about grief, trauma, fear, and healing. The musical in particular shows how our vision of the world is distorted when we view it through the lens of our grief, our trauma, and our fears. People who are perfectly well may be hiding in their beds, afraid to get up and go outside. People who are lonely may be so focused on their grief that they can't see the possibilities for love and connection which are right in front of them.

The trauma of colonialism warps our view of other cultures and places us deeply in denial about the ways in which we may still be complicit in and both suffering and benefiting from its legacy. The fragments of Indian culture we see and hear in the play are seen very subjectively, filtered through Mary's limited experiences and traumatized memories of her time there. We also see, in the imperiousness of her behavior at the beginning of the story, the inscriptions which had already begun to be written on her character by those experiences.

The personal healing for these characters comes when they find their sense of purpose. A connection is finally made - perhaps with a robin, perhaps a cousin, perhaps a patch of forget-me-nots. On the heels of this connection comes that sense of purpose; in the drive to speak out on behalf of the voiceless and to rise with another's healing in their wings. The larger healing still awaits us all.


