The University will take immediate and responsive action to any report of retaliation and many pursue disciplinary action as appropriate.

Your Rights Under Title IX

THE RIGHT to live and learn at SUU free from sexual misconduct.

THE RIGHT to file a complaint according to SUU's sexual misconduct policy. You also have the right to request a criminal investigation.

THE RIGHT to interim support and reasonable protective measures to help you continue to live and learn at SUU.

THE RIGHT to understand that SUU will undertake a prompt and thorough investigation of all reports of sexual misconduct.

THE RIGHT to request and obtain a No Contact order and to receive information about SUU's policies and procedures to protect students.

THE RIGHT to use resources, process, and support, and to report to the Title IX Coordinator if your rights have been violated.

THE RIGHT to be free from retaliation for exercising your rights.

THE RIGHT to access on-and off-campus support and health services. For more information, contact CAPS at 435-865-8621
