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Classes begin Monday, June 5 and finish with finals on Friday, July 7. Students are required to attend all classes. Non-attendance for any reason (even illness) must have **prior** approval from a staff member to be excused. Any student who fails course work will jeopardize his/her opportunity for participating in the urban experience and may be sent home early. Taking finals early requires permission of the instructor and will cost \$10 per class in addition to loss of completion bonus.

DESCRIPTION OF SUMMER CLASSES

BIOL 1010/1015 - Introduction to Biology/ Biology Lab – 4 Credit Hours

A course emphasizing mechanisms of living systems and impact of biological problems on human affairs. Course is designed to foster critical thinking, problem solving and the application of scientific thinking. Lecture and lab are taken together in this section.

ENGL 0990 - Reading and Writing Skills – 0 Credit Hours

This course is designed to develop the critical reading and writing skills necessary for survival in college courses. This course will prepare the student to enter English 1010.

ENGL 1010 - Introduction to Composition – 3 Credit Hours

Prerequisite: ACT Test English score of at least 17 or must pass an SUU Accuplacer Test. This course is a disciplined approach to the rhetoric of English composition with emphasis on organization and development in the whole composition, on coherence and effectiveness in paragraphs, and on maturity and flexibility and sentence style.

ENGL 2010 – Intermediate Writing: Selected Topics – 3 Credit Hours

Prerequisite: Passing score from ENG 1010. This course emphasizes the development of an effective academic style in argumentative essays that make use of traditional rhetorical patterns. A major research paper is required. Note that you cannot take this class until you have successfully completed ENGL 1010!

GERM 1010 – Beginning German I – 4 Credit Hours

Designed for students with little or no language experience, this course will emphasize conversation, vocabulary building, and basic grammar.

MATH 0990 - Beginning Algebra – 0 Credit Hours

Explores signed numbers, variables and algebraic expressions, linear equations, polynomials, integer exponents, roots, factoring, straight lines, graphing, rational expressions.

MATH 1010 - Intermediate Algebra – 5 Credit Hours

Must be taken together with UNIV 1020. Prerequisite: ACT test math score at least 18/60. Explores real number system, linear equations, and inequalities, factoring, rational expressions, exponents and radicals, complex numbers, quadratic equations, systems of linear equations.

NFS 1020 - Scientific Foundations of Human Nutrition –3 Credit Hours

An introduction to the science of nutrition and the relationship of food intake and health. Nutrient requirements and food selection to meet those requirements are discussed. Students evaluate their own food intake and eating behaviors and learn to be informed consumers of food and nutrition information.

SPAN 0990 - Introduction to Spanish – 0 Credit Hours

This is an introduction course designed for students with little language experience. This course will emphasize conversation, vocabulary building, and basic grammar.

UNIV 1020 – Strategies for Success – 1 Credit Hour

Must be taken together with Math 1010. Designed to successfully launch students' university careers and to equip students with the tools and abilities to increase their career and academic skills.

TRAVEL PERMISSION STATEMENT

SUU UB policy states that Upward Bound staff members will assume responsibility for all summer participants until the student is released to the responsibility of a parent, or other person designated by the parent. **The designation of the responsible party must be done in writing at least 24 hours in advance** of the activity. Written consent must state (1) **who** the student may ride with, (2) **the times** of leaving and returning, (3) **the dates** and purpose if you need us to know that information, and the **signature** of the parent or guardian giving permission.

The following form can be submitted on this application. Otherwise, consent must be written for each individual event. **If there is no parent/guardian signature on at the bottom of this form, or no designated persons listed, the student will be allowed to ride only with Upward Bound staff.**

NOTE: If a student leaves the program for a weekend, it is necessary that the parent or guardian arrange for the student's return to the residential hall by **10:00 PM on Sunday evening**. Students must submit final week-end plans by 7:00 PM each Wednesday prior to the weekend or they are subject to a fine of \$5.00.

Concurrent Enrollment Instructions

New first time concurrent enrollment (have never received credit for classes at SUU):

1. Go to SUU.EDU
2. Select APPLY on the top right part of the page header.
3. Select the **Undergraduate** link.
4. Select the Summer choice and 2017 for the Application year.
5. This should bring up the **Undergraduate Application for Admission** form.
6. Complete the application. Be sure to select Summer 2017 as the term and Concurrent Enrollment as the Undergraduate Major.
7. Read the Information page. It has some good info that you will need to know for later years. Note that you will NOT be paying an application fee. Upward Bound will take care of that.
8. Submit the application.
9. When the Application Fee Payment page comes up, select 'pay later'.
10. Fax a high school transcript to 435.865.8223, email to adminfo@suu.edu or snail mail it to the address in the letterhead above.
11. Your application will be complete when your transcript is received.

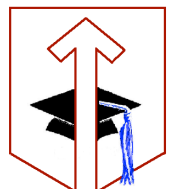

Dear Parent(s):

Your student is applying to attend the 2017 Upward Bound Summer Component at Southern Utah University. Please keep this letter as it contains important information about the summer schedule. Complete the parental forms on the application and return to your student's high school UB Counselor by April 1st.

The Upward Bound Summer Component begins on **Sunday, June 4th, 2017**. Students should arrive at the *Eccles A Resident Hall* lobby no earlier than 3:00 PM and no later than 5:00 PM that day. Staff will be on hand to welcome them and assign dorm rooms. Call your student's Upward Bound high school advisor for information about transportation. *Eccles A* is located on the corner of 500 West and 200 South, just south of the SUU campus.

Classes begin Monday morning, **June 5th at 8:00 AM**, and will be held every weekday morning for 4 to 5 hours, depending on your student's class schedule. Finals will be held **Friday** morning, **July 7th**. Students not taking finals will receive a failing class grade. Early finals are discouraged and are subject to 3 weeks prior arrangement with the instructors, with a \$10 fee for each one taken early. Also, students taking early finals will not receive a completion bonus. Any student who fails a class, is fired from a job site, or fails to comply with the UB policies can be sent home early, at their parents' expense.

Sheets, blankets, pillows, towels and etc. are **not** provided for the students. Each student will need to furnish his/her own. The beds are twin sized and a sleeping bag can be used instead of a blanket.

We provide all meals for the students at the university cafeteria. Students will not have time or cooking supplies to cook meals. UB also pays for meals when we travel. We discourage the student's use of their weekly stipends for food. Their weekly stipends are \$10, with a completion bonus of \$25 at the end of the 5th week, just before they leave for the Urban Experience.

We will leave the morning of **July 8th for our Urban Experience**. At its conclusion, we will drop the students off at their respective high schools on **Wednesday, July 12th** (Milford students may be dropped off at Beaver High). Your student will contact you later with drop-off times so you can meet him/her for transportation home.

Students cannot make or accept phone calls during class, job sites, study hall, or after 11:00 PM, Utah time. Please don't worry if your student does not return your phone call promptly. Their UB schedule is very busy. We encourage you to keep contact by mail.

Expect your student to be homesick and sad sometimes. You are the person he/she will trust with complaints, disappointments, failures, and fears. This doesn't mean that your student is having a terrible experience or that he/she should return home. Homesickness is a normal part of learning to live independently. Please encourage your student to stay and finish his or her classes.

Send funny cards, pictures drawn by a sibling or cousin, cartoons or clippings from the local paper, or family photos, but don't be hurt if your student fails to write back. Their schedule is very full. Praise your student's academic accomplishments and show how much you value these achievements. A word of praise can mean a lot!

Keep the lines of communication open. Ask not, “How are you doing?” but, “What are you doing?” Listen to them. Try not to give advice, instead, ask “How are you going to handle this?”

If you plan to visit campus, let your student know you’re coming. They have to schedule almost every minute of their time to be able to attend classes and complete homework on time. Also, we have a closed campus policy and **students cannot leave a scheduled activity without 24 hours of prior notification** to the UB Director or Assistant Director, plus permission from you, the parent or guardian.

Students may go home on weekends with written permission from a parent or guardian, and at your discretion and expense. Students must be back at Eccles Hall on **Sunday evenings by 10:00 PM** for the weekly planning meeting. Saturday activities are provided for students who remain on campus during the weekends. All of these activities are well supervised and very safe for all the students. Students who change their weekend plans **after 7:00 PM on Wednesday are fined \$5.00** to cover cancellation costs and higher last minute rates for activities.

There are no scheduled activities on Sunday and students may attend religious functions if they desire to do so. They must make arrangements with a staff member for transportation and supervision as needed.
