## SCHOLARSHIP SPOTLIGHT

AMVETS is proud to offer scholarships/grants to our nation's Veterans, Active Duty, Guard and Reserves; their Spouses as well as their Children and Grandchildren. AMVETS scholarships are designed to fulfill a financial gap after all Federal/State grants and/or scholarships available to an eligible applicant have been exhausted.



Here are some of the scholarships awarded annually and funded by the AMVETS National Service Foundation:

- Six \$4,000 scholarships for high school seniors (\$1,000 a year of a four-year undergraduate program or at an accredited technical/trade leading to certification or a degree; one selected from each district)
- Three \$4,000 scholarships for veterans (\$1,000 a year of a four-year undergraduate program or certification/degree from an accredited technical/trade school; no regard for district boundaries)
- One \$1,000 scholarship for a JROTC high school senior entering any undergraduate program (no regard for district boundaries)

#### Eligible Applicants Must:

- Apply between January through April 30th
  - Incomplete and late entries will be disqualified
- Have a 3.0 GPA
- Be a United States Citizen

### Know Before You Go:AA

- There is an 8-mile scenic paved drive through the park where you get to see some of the Waterpocket Fold, a geologic monocline extending almost 100 miles. It will take about 2 hours round trip
- There are limited services in the park but it is surrounded by small towns with groceries, restaurants, gas, and lodging
- There is very little to no cellular reception in the park. The closest towns with reception and internet are Torrey (11 miles west of the visitor center) and Hanksville (37 miles east of the visitor center)

### Activity to Try: CASSIDY ARCH HIKE

- Cassidy Arch is a natural stone arch named after Butch Cassidy who reportedly had a hideout in Grand Wash at the beginning of the trailhead
- It is a strenuous 1.7 miles to the arch (one way) with a 670 feet climb in elevation so take plenty of water
- The parking area is located on a narrow unpaved, gravel road located in Grand Wash so use caution if storms are threatening and do not attempt to cross flooded areas
